## DON'T LET THEM.

The FBI advises consumers to do research before clicking on any links claiming to provide information on the virus, contributing to charity online through social media, donating to a crowd funding campaign, buying products online or giving personal data in order to receive money or benefits.

Be on the lookout for:

- 1.) Fake emails from CDC and prevention or other organizations claiming to have information on COVID-19
- 2.) Phishing emails asking for personal information related to the economic stimulus checks
  - 3.) Airline carrier refunds, fake cures and vaccines or fake testing kits.
  - 4.) Counterfeit products that claim to prevent, treat, diagnose or cure.

The FBI reminds you to practice good "cyber hygiene" and follow security measures including the following:

- 1.) Do not open attachments or click any email links
  - 2.) Do not share personal information
- 3.) Always be sure the website your visiting is legitimate
- 4.) Check for misspelled words or wrong domains within the link your using.

In addition, if you are experiencing any symptoms that you think could be related to COVID-19 please consult your primary care physician.
